In accordance with the Truro Town Charter, Chapter 6-4-4, and in response to April 30, 2019 Town Meeting, Article 17's motion to establish a Climate Action Committee, the Select Board voted to enact the following Charge:

Climate Action Committee

The Climate Action Committee's primary focus will be to investigate, study, and make recommendations to the Select Board on:

- ◆ The carbon footprint of all Town-owned facilities and equipment.
- Methods for minimizing the Town's carbon footprint.
- ◆ The Town's vulnerabilities to the consequences of climate change.
- Methods for minimizing the Town's vulnerabilities to the consequences of climate change.

The Climate Action Committee will also maintain communications with the Truro Energy Committee, as well as with other Climate Committees in Barnstable County, and with county and state commissions, to ensure that Truro works effectively with the wider community in achieving the above Town goals.

The Climate Action Committee may also recommend to the Select Board whatever actions are necessary to implement the Town's commitment to the U.S. Mayors' Cities Climate Protection Agreement, and, if approved, take such actions, including:

- ◆ To prepare a baseline study of the greenhouse gas emissions of the entire town of Truro, including municipal, residential, institutional, and commercial sectors, in concert with the Truro Energy Committee.
- ◆ To prepare a baseline study of Truro's vulnerabilities to the consequences of climate change that builds on work initiated by staff and regional efforts.
- ◆ To prepare recommendations outlining the specific policies necessary to achieve carbon reduction and vulnerability mitigation goals, for the approval of the Select Board, in concert with the Truro Energy Committee as appropriate.
- ◆ To conduct public education and outreach to residents, homeowners, business, and other stakeholders about Truro's carbon footprint and its climate vulnerabilities.
- ◆ To provide meaningful options for individuals to reduce carbon footprint, including options for groups and/or neighborhoods.
- ◆ To draft a community-wide climate action plan for Truro that sets short and long-term goals for reducing Truro's carbon footprint and its climate vulnerabilities to the maximum extent practical.
- ◆ To provide an annual report for inclusion in the Annual Town Report describing its efforts and accomplishments.

Committee Structure and Term

The Climate Action Committee will include five (5) citizen members-at large with one alternate member. Staff will be assigned as deemed appropriate by the Town Manager. The Committee is authorized to seek outside expert advice. If funding is deemed necessary, in support of the Committee, an expense budget should be submitted in advance to Town Manager for inclusion in the budget presentation.

This is to be a Standing Committee that will serve indefinitely and will provide quarterly progress reports to the Select Board.





Select Board Members Present: Janet Worthington, Chair; Susan Areson, Maureen Burgess, Kristen Reed, Robert Weinstein

Present: Town Manager Rae Ann Palmer; Assistant Town Manager Kelly Sullivan-Clark

Chair Janet Worthington called meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

TABLED ITEM

William Souza submitted a letter on behalf of his son Jeffrey Souza officially withdrawing their application for the shellfish aquaculture tidal grant off Cold Storage Beach. Kristen Reed commented on the need for a policy on Town-owned beaches and waterfront for future use for aquaculture. Rae Ann Palmer said the Shellfish Committee is discussing this.

SELECT BOARD ACTION

Colonial Village Units Condo Conversion

Health/Conservation Agent Emily Beebe explained the request for approval of the conversion of two units of Colonial Village Condominiums to year-round use. She said all the paperwork was in order, and the Town had conducted all the required inspections. Rae Ann Palmer reviewed the process of releasing the covenant. Ms. Beebe said that the next conversion would be a release for all units in a condominium and commented on some of the conversions that are underway.

Robert Weinstein moved to approve the year-round use and removal of the seasonal covenant for two of the ten Colonial Village Condominiums located at 630 Shore Rd. Kristen Reed seconded, and the motion carried 5-0.

Select Board Goals & Objectives for FY2020

Town Manager Rae Ann Palmer said the public hearing had been held in June. There had been subsequent discussion of the Fiscal Year 2020 *Goals and Objectives*. Susan Areson and Maureen Burgess made suggestions for the wording of CS-6. Ms. Palmer read the new CS-6 objective with the amendments.

Kristen Reed moved to approve the Fiscal Year 2020 Select Board *Goals and Objectives* as amended. Robert Weinstein seconded, and the motion carried 5-0.

CDP Housing Institute Funding Request

Ms. Palmer explained the application from the Community Development Partnership (CDP) for a contribution of \$7,500 from the Truro Affordable Housing Trust Fund for the 2019 Housing

Institute. Susan Areson said she had attended both sessions of the Cape Housing Institute and supports the terrific program. Kristen Reed said she will be attending it in fall.

Kristen Reed moved to approve the use of \$7,500 of Affordable Housing Trust funds for the Cape Housing Institute Year 3. Maureen Burgess seconded, and the motion carried 5-0.

Climate Action Committee Charge & Energy Committee Charge Edits

Rae Ann Palmer said there has been a significant response of people wanting to be on the Climate Action Committee. She and Assistant Town Manager Kelly Clark have worked on the charge and a revised charge of the Energy Committee. Health/Conservation Agent Emily Beebe has also offered input on the Climate Action Committee charge. Brian Boyle, Chair of the Energy Committee came forward to say his committee is excited about the creation of the Climate Action Committee. He said there would be overlap in their concerns, but the Energy Committee will be able to focus on their main areas dealing with Town infrastructure. Chair Janet Worthington invited the Energy Committee to present any programs of interest in the Select Board Chambers, where the presentation could be videotaped and shared. Mr. Boyle reported on some of the upcoming programs that are planned this summer. Robert Weinstein expressed concerns about lawns and bicycle carriers on vehicles. He welcomed exchange of ideas between the Energy and Climate Action Committees on water issues. Susan Areson asked Emily Beebe about the Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness (MVP) project. Ms. Beebe returned to explain that the Cape Cod Commission had forwarded Truro's application to the State to become an MVP Community and become eligible for action grants for things identified in the Hazard Mitigation Plan, done with the Town of Wellfleet. She discussed the Coastal Resiliency Plan and said the Town should learn soon if it will receive a Coastal Zone Management (CZM) grant with the other Outer Cape towns. The grant will help Truro address sea level rise and storms hitting the shore, Ms. Palmer said. Ms. Beebe said that is the foundation of the efforts which the Climate Action and Energy Committees will undertake. The Cape Cod Commission and Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) have a transportation plan on infrastructure that that is available in the Town Hall and online, according to Mr. Weinstein.

Susan Areson moved to approve the charge for the Climate Action Committee and the revised charge of the Energy Committee. Maureen Burgess seconded, and the motion carried 5-0.

Kristen Reed had attended a Women's Elected Officials Conference at Wellesley College. Dr. Johnson, president of college, gave the speech on importance of women making policies. Ms. Reed reminded people to share their comments for the Walsh Property by August 15th.

Janet Worthington thanked everyone at the Harbor for doing an awesome job. In light of the mid-Cape tornadoes and with hurricane season approaching, she said that Truro needs to work on emergency preparedness by September to be sure part-time residents were included. People should be checking on their neighbors already, she said. So far, about seven people have signed up to be neighborhood captains. The Council on Aging Board is looking for new members, Chair Worthington said.

Maureen Burgess reported that Robert Weinstein, Rae Ann Palmer and she have continued to work with High Dune Cannabis Cooperative on their Host Community Agreement. She said she had read about the slow process of approvals of cannabis businesses. The Chair of the Planning Board has expressed interest in having a joint meeting with the Select Board in early fall. They are now working on bylaws and making the process for applications smoother, Ms. Burgess said.

Robert Weinstein said he had attended his first Shellfish Advisory Committee, where he had suggested that they consider a policy about access to shellfish grants for people who want to apply for an Aquaculture Development Area (ADA). Shellfish Advisory Committee members called his attention to the problem of boaters interfering with gear in the ADA area. They would like to get the local Commander of the United States Coastguard to discuss designating the ADA as a prohibited zone for certain boating activities. The last MPO meeting discussed a dedicated bike path extension on the east side of Rte. 6 from Wellfleet to Provincetown. The plan is on the MPO and Cape Cod Commission websites. He was troubled that the shark emergency kits have been stolen and tampered with at two beaches.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Rae Ann Palmer gave an update from the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency about conditions and power outages in the mid-Cape after the tornadoes. Those towns are looking for tree clearing help but have not yet contacted Truro. She had met with the Superintendent of the National Seashore again to discuss sharks and other issues. Head of the Meadow Beach will be getting one of the new real time buoys that will initiate a call to lifeguards and dispatch if a tagged shark swims by. The buoy installation will be part of a two-year study on shark behavior off Truro beaches. She said there are two roving EMTs on the beaches. The Head of the Meadow bike trail will have an opening ceremony soon. The One-Cape Summit will be held on Monday and Tuesday of next week, and all Select Board members are invited to attend. Ms. Palmer corrected a reference to CCC which stood for Cannabis Control Commission, not the

Cape Cod Commission. The cooling station was staffed on the weekend, but no one showed up. She reported on staff vacancies. There are three applicants for Town Planner who will be interviewed. She expects the COA Director applications to close in mid-August. Kelly Clark and Damion Clements will do a second round of interviews for the Council On Aging/Recreation & Beach Admin position, and applications for an assistant custodian are under consideration.

NEXT MEETING AGENDA

Town Manager Rae Ann Palmer reviewed agenda items for the next meetings. The August 13, 2019 meeting agenda includes: public hearings for Salty Market and Eversource, interviews for the Climate Action Committee; discussion of security camera policy and cost; a Suicide Prevention Proclamation; and alcohol licenses. Depending upon everyone's schedule, the August 27, 2019 meeting may be held as an afternoon work session to discuss the Walsh Property. Janet Worthington suggested inviting the facilitator to the work session. Ms. Palmer said Truro has a proposal from the Consensus Building Institute to help with the process for the Walsh Property. She will e-mail this to Select Board members. An emergency preparedness session will be scheduled separately.

ADJOURNMENT

Maureen Burgess moved to adjourn. Robert Weinstein seconded, and the motion carried 5-0. The meeting was adjourned at 5:59 p.m.

ITEM: Massworks 2019 Infrastructure Grant Program Authorization

EXPLANATION: Staff prepared a grant application for the 2019 MassWorks Infrastructure Grant Program offered by the Executive Office of Housing and Economic Development. The grant request for \$405,880.00 would be used for Phase I of the North Truro water line extension to the Cloverleaf site. Phase I will expand the water line 1,500 feet from the intersection of Shore Road and Highland Road, through the North Truro Center General Business district, to the south end of the Cloverleaf site and 800 feet from Firehouse Road, under Route 6 to the north end of the site. Design and engineering work was completed using MassHousing Planning for Housing Production Technical Assistance Grant funds. The project is nearly ready for bid. If awarded, this grant will fund the construction costs associated with Phase I.

In accordance with the Select Board's Policy Memorandum #32: Grant and Gift Acceptance Policy for the Town of Truro, the Board must authorize the acceptance of these grant funds.

FINANCIAL SOURCE (IF APPLICABLE): Executive Office of Housing and Economic Development's 2019 MassWorks Infrastructure Grant

IMPACT IF NOT APPROVED: The grant funds, if awarded, will not be accepted.

SUGGESTED ACTION: Motion to authorize Town Manager Palmer to accept 2019 MassWorks Infrastructure Grant funds if awarded and to expend said funds for the water line expansion project.

POLICY MEMORANDUM #32

Date: April 7, 2004; Revised December 5, 2017

Subject: GRANT AND GIFT ACCEPTANCE POLICY FOR THE TOWN OF TRURO

This policy applies to grants and gifts given to the Town of Truro, and not to any individual employee or group of employees of the Town.

In accordance with G.L. c. 44 §53A, any amounts received as a grant or gift to the Town of Truro may be expended for the purposes of such grant or gift with approval by the Board of Selectmen.

Grants or gifts of cash, whether restricted or unrestricted, shall be acknowledged as soon as possible, with date and amount of grant or gift clearly stated, and with the following (or similar) statement:

"No goods or services have been rendered in consideration of this gift."

This is required by the IRS in order that under-the-table payments for services are not credited as gifts.

Restricted grants or gifts of cash shall be acknowledged as above. It is important that the restriction be noted in writing, as well as the donor's wish to have any interest generated by the gift used for the restricted purpose. It is important that fund raisers ask donors to assign, in writing, interest earned by their grants or gifts to be used as they wish, i.e., toward the same restricted purpose as the grant or gift itself; otherwise, interest will be added to the General Fund. If the express written terms of the gift or grant stipulate that interest earned by their grants or gifts are to be used for the same restricted purpose as the gift itself, interest on the grant or gift funds shall remain with and become a part of the grant or gift without further appropriation.

Unrestricted grants or gifts of cash are the most useful because they can be used for whatever is deemed by the organization to be most pressing at any given moment. Donors of such grants or gifts should also be asked to direct earned interest, in writing, to the gift fund.

Grants or gifts of appreciated securities are handled and credited by the Town Clerk/Treasurer, but are acknowledged by the fund-raising organization using figures provided. These donors should be asked to express, in writing, how interest generated by these grants or gifts should be used, as above, and the same disclaimer stated on the letter of thanks.

Gifts-in-kind are any non-monetary donations which includes articles, art, furniture, etc., deemed by donors to have a use or a future use to the recipient. Proposed gifts-in-kind must be considered by the Town Manager for items with a current perceived value of \$25,000.00 or less or by the Board of Selectmen for items with a current perceived value of \$25,000.01 or more on a case-by-case basis to determine whether the gift will be accepted or respectfully declined. The potential donor should submit a detailed description of the item(s) and the proposed date of the gift. The Town of Truro has no obligation to accept any/all gifts offered. When considering the acceptance of the gift, the Town will consider the value offered by the gift, the maintenance and short- and long-term associated costs, and the storage/ placement of the gift.

At the time that a gift it accepted, the Town along with the donor will determine whether the gift should be kept in perpetuity or may be declared surplus at a later date.

No monetary value will be attributed to gifts-in-kind. The Town of Truro cannot assign a value and the donor will be responsible for the payment for any independent appraisal(s) of the worth of the article(s) that the donor wishes to secure.
