Key Topics

CPC Grant Update

- Grant Approved: The Disabilities Commission received approval for the full requested amount of \$350,000 from the Community Preservation Committee (CPC).
- **Permitting Costs**: A significant portion of the grant (\$100,000) is allocated for permitting fees, which are necessary to proceed with the project.
- Project Timeline: The project timeline extends into 2026, with bidding and construction anticipated to be completed by 2027.
- Lowest Bidder Concern: Concerns were raised about the requirement to select the lowest bidder, potentially impacting the quality of work. Damion highlighted the importance of a detailed proposal process to mitigate this risk.

Puma Park Renovations

 Renovation Plans: The Recreation Commission is initiating plans for renovations at Puma Park, with a focus on immediate repairs and improvements.

March Kickoff Event: A community event is scheduled for March 29 to gather input and ideas for the park renovations.

Office of Town Clerk

- Accessibility Focus: The Disabilities Commission aims to collaborate with the Recreation Commission to ensure the renovations prioritize multi-generational accessibility, incorporating features such as:
 - o Benches and shade structures
 - Safe and accessible playground surfaces
 - o Communication boards
- Funding for Communication Boards: The Friends of the Library previously pledged \$1,500 towards communication boards, but the total cost is estimated to be at least \$4,000.

Town-Wide Senior/Multi-Generational Needs Assessment

- **Upcoming Meeting**: Deborah will be attending a meeting on Wednesday with a consultant to discuss the design and implementation of a town-wide senior/multi-generational needs assessment.
- Collaboration and Funding: The assessment aims to foster collaboration between town committees and potentially secure funding for identified needs.
- Previous Assessment Concerns: A previous needs assessment in 2018 faced challenges due to perceived poor communication and lack of clarity regarding its purpose and impact. The Commission emphasizes the importance of clear communication and a well-defined scope for the upcoming assessment.
- **Commission Priorities**: The Disabilities Commission identifies several key priorities for the assessment:
 - o Multi-generational accessibility in public spaces
 - Digital accessibility of the town website, including closed captioning for town meetings and online content.
 - Exploration of multi-generational caregiver support services, potentially modeled after a program in Chatham.

Caregiver Support

- **Need for Services**: The discussion highlighted the need for caregiver support services in Truro, encompassing various age groups and caregiving situations.
- **Potential Models**: The Commission discussed the possibility of establishing a multi-generational caregiver support group or exploring options for respite care, drawing inspiration from a program in Chatham.
- Weekend Availability: The importance of offering support services on weekends to accommodate working caregivers was emphasized.

 Coordination and Resources: The Commission recognizes the need to coordinate with existing resources and explore potential funding sources to develop comprehensive caregiver support initiatives.

Decisions Made

- Meeting Time Change: The Commission tentatively agreed to change their regular meeting time, pending confirmation from Mary and Jane.
- Joint Meeting in May: A joint meeting with the Beach Advisory Commission is scheduled for May 1st at 4:00 PM to discuss the grant application and next steps.

Next Steps

- Meeting Time Confirmation: Hannah and Amy will confirm the availability of Mary and Jane for a meeting time change to 3:00 or 4:00 PM on Fridays.
- Needs Assessment Meeting: Deborah will represent the Commission at the needs assessment meeting on Wednesday and advocate for the identified priorities.
- Puma Park Collaboration: The Commission will engage with the Recreation Commission to contribute to the planning and design of Puma Park renovations, ensuring multi-generational accessibility is prioritized.
- Caregiver Support Exploration: The Commission will further explore potential models and resources for developing multi-generational caregiver support services in Truro.

Conclusion

- Positive Momentum: The meeting reflected positive momentum with the successful CPC grant approval and the opportunity to contribute to Puma Park renovations and the town-wide needs assessment.
- Collaboration is Key: The importance of collaboration with other town committees and community stakeholders was emphasized throughout the meeting.

 to advocating for the needs of individuals with disabilities and promoting
 accessibility and inclusivity throughout Truro.
