1. Call to Order


- The meeting was called to order by Chelsea Loughran.
- Present: Chelsea Loughran, Beth Cook, Christine McGee, Lindsey White, Drew Locke
- Town Staff Present: Austin Smith, Stephanie Rein
- Absent: Peter Morris
- Public Comment: Hannah King

2. Summer Programming Updates

- Field Trips & Swim Lessons:
 - o The summer calendar is finalized.
 - o The program aligns with Wellfleet's summer schedule, ensuring consistency in timing.
 - o Swim lessons start the same day as the summer rec program.
 - o Staffing coverage will be provided for children who opt out of swim lessons.
 - o Coordination is ongoing to schedule swim lesson groups based on skill levels and time slots.
- Swim Lesson Costs & Financial Assistance:
 - Cost: \$125 for 7 weeks, five days per week.
 - Sibling discounts available (\$65 for second child, subject to confirmation).
 - Friends of Truro Recreation is exploring ways to fund scholarships for swim lessons.
 - The committee discussed fundraising ideas such as a raffle at a comhole event to raise money for swim lesson scholarships.

3. Summer Recreation Program Pricing Approval

- Proposed 4.5% increase in fees to offset costs.
- Previous cost: \$1,100 for the full summer.
- Motion to approve the new pricing structure was made by Christine McGee, seconded by Beth Cook.
- Vote: Approved unanimously.
- Discussion on Fee Impact:
 - o The fee increase aims to balance **affordability for working families** while maintaining program sustainability.
 - o Non-residents bear a larger portion of the increase.
 - o Compared to other towns, the Truro summer rec program remains one of the most affordable.
 - Potential return of families who left for Provincetown's longer program due to improved offerings in Truro.



4. OSTP (Out-of-School Time Program) Registration & Communication

- Sign-up process:
 - Adam is sending weekly reminders to parents.
 - o Registration closes on Sundays before each week starts.
 - o Late sign-ups create logistical challenges with bus coordination and attendance tracking.
- Issues & Concerns:
 - o Parents noted confusion about sign-up deadlines.
 - Some families had trouble enrolling late due to unexpected scheduling issues.
 - o Discussion on day-of sign-ups and the need for a clearer process to handle emergencies.

5. Shade Structures & Outdoor Activity Improvements

- Concerns about excessive heat limiting outdoor activities.
- Past discussions about purchasing umbrella shades for picnic tables were revisited.
- Grant opportunities for permanent sunshade structures through the American Dermatological Association will be explored.
- CPC (Community Preservation Committee) funding might be pursued for long-term shading solutions.

6. Intergenerational Programming Expansion

- TCS students visited the COA (Council on Aging) for Valentine's Day—a highly praised event.
- Upcoming TCS Cares Club visit to COA to play board games.
- Proposal to combine gardening and board games to allow more student participation.
- Encouragement to expand cross-generational events with COA.

7. OSTP Behavior Policy & Parent Communication

- Current discipline tracking system:
 - Behaviors are categorized into three tiers (minor, moderate, major infractions).
 - Parent communication is inconsistent, leading to concerns about transparency.
 - Incidents sometimes result in immediate suspensions, but policies differ from what parents signed.
- Action Items:
 - Unify policies across all documentation (MyRec, handbook, and printed policies).
 - o Ensure parents sign off on behavior policies at enrollment.
 - Improve incident reporting consistency to prevent discrepancies between staff reports and video footage.

8. Facilities & Scheduling Updates

- April vacation programming will take place at the Community Center due to construction at the school.
- Summer registrations are set to open on April 15th.
- Spring Events:
 - Spring Sprung Scavenger Hunt at Truro Vineyards.
 - o T-ball starts on April 30th.
- Postseason Recreation Programming:
 - o Exploring options for Wellfleet students to participate.
 - Need for additional outdoor shade structures at the Community Center.

9. Volunteer Appreciation & Community Engagement

- Upcoming Volunteer Appreciation Event planned for September.
- Discussion on securing sufficient funding to accommodate potential high turnout.
- Encouragement to register volunteers in advance for accurate planning.

10. Teen Engagement & Future Programming

- Current participation is low—most attendees live near the Community Center.
- Transportation is a key barrier to increasing teen involvement.
- Exploring teen-centered events with transportation solutions.

11. Adjournment

- The meeting was adjourned with a motion by Chelsea Loughran, seconded by Beth Cook.
