Announcements:

Longnook Beach will reopen for swimming at 9 AM on Saturday. We remind beach goers to practice shark safety:

- Don't swim where seals are present.
- Don't swim too far from shore.
- Avoid swimming early and late in the day (when sharks tend to feed.)
- Swim in groups.
- Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to sharks.)
- Avoid cloudy water (sharks could mistake you for prey.)
- Avoid surfing alone.
- Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
- Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.

Beach Gate Attendants will be informing patrons of the recent shark activity in the area and distributing Cape Cod Great White Shark Safety brochures.

This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office:

- On Wednesday August 15 at approximately 4:11 pm, Truro Police & Fire responded to a 911 call advising that a person sustained a shark bite on Longnook Beach. The victim was a 61 year old male who reported that he received the injury while standing in water approximately 30 yards off shore. He was treated by Truro Fire and Police and transported to the Marconi Site helipad in Wellfleet, where he was then flown via helicopter to Tufts Medical Center in Boston. It has since been determined that he was on CCNS property. The training and commitment of our staff was evident from their quick and effective handling of the situation. Many thanks to the community members and visitors that assisted the victim until staff arrived and to those who helped carry him up the bank to the parking lot.
- Longnook Beach remained closed for swimming through Friday. Due to no confirmed sightings of Great White Sharks at Longnook Beach since Thursday, August 16, 2018, swimming will reopen at Longnook Beach on Saturday, August 18, 2018 at 9:00 am. Please practice shark safety.
- Health & Conservation Agent Beebe and I attended day one of the Cape Cod Commission's One Cape Summit which focused on coastal resiliency and water quality. Governor Charlie Baker was the featured speaker.
- Board of Selectmen Chair Bob Weinstein and I attended day two of the One Cape Summit with the focus shifting to housing and economic resiliency. We started the morning at the Councilor's breakfast, featuring Secretary Jay Ash (Housing and Economic Development) who was instrumental in assisting the Town in acquiring the Cloverleaf property. There were thought provoking presenters on both days.

Police Department

Work will include extending the stone swale from the south bound exit ramp clover leaf area to the drainage headwall closest to route six. An additional stone swale will be added along the south bound ramp to Highland Road covering the entire length of the ramp area. This will be a great addition to the drainage system because currently there is nothing on the south bound ramp shoulder addressing storm water drainage. All pipes in the drainage system on Highland and the clover leaf area will be jetted (cleaned) including removing sediment build-up at the culvert headwall located behind 2 Pond Road.
- Ag Fair preparation has begun, snow fencing has been installed around concert park, and Eversource will restore power to the area next week.
- A new tide gate has been installed on Town Center Road, allowing water to drain from the East portion
 of the Pamet River.
