- We received word that the Town was awarded second place in the Massachusetts Municipal Association's Town Report Contest for our population category.
- There are a number of elected offices that will be included on the 2018 annual election ballot. Nomination

- Staff met with Dr. Mark Borrelli of the Center for Coastal Studies to review the Coastal Zone Management grant Inundation Pathways database and some of the data. It was exciting to see how closely the data matched the actual effects of our most recent storm event.
- The 2018 Annual Town Meeting Warrant opened on January 24, 2018 and will remain open for submission of articles until March 13, 2018 at 4:00 pm. The deadline for money articles is February 9, 2018.
- The Budget Task Force met on Monday January 22 to review the following budgets: Truro Central School
 and the Truro Public Library. On Monday February 5 at 8:00 am at the Truro Town Hall, the Budget Task
 Force will convene to review budgets for the Public Works, Administration, Finance and Information
 Technologies departments. As a reminder, the public is encouraged to attend these open meetings and

Department News:

Fire Department

- The Department responded to 8 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 5 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 26 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations, calls for public service assistance and a good intent calls.
- The Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) applications have been completed and will be submitted this
 week. The Department is applying for Federal grant monies to replace our water tender and thermal
 imaging equipment.
- Firefighter Sean Anderson has graduated from the 10 week Career Recruit Training program at the Massachusetts Fire Academy in Stow. Congratulations Sean on a job well done.
- The Town will be working to provide a new comprehensive emergency notification and safety alert system for the Town. This system will be able to provide valuable and real time Public Service Announcements (PSA's) as well as valuable safety notifications to residents and visitors to our community.
- Chief Collins has been working on developing a training calendar that will incorporate regional training programs and invite our neighboring communities to enhance delivery of fire protections services on the Outer Cape. These programs will range from basic skills to advanced vehicle extrication programs.
- Chief Collins attended the Massachusetts Municipal Association (MMA) conference in Boston with Assistant Town Manager Clark. The conference provided many valuable programs pertaining to the operation of not only Town Government but Department specific programs as well.

Department of Public Works

As a reminder the Transfer Station will be closed Monday, February 19, 2018 in observance of

Presidents Day.

- Due to heavy rain this week, DPW personnel have been actively clearing water ways and catch basins. The catch basin truck will be out cleaning the basins well into next week.
- Yard waste located at the Transfer Station is scheduled to be removed on January 29, 2018 through February 9, 2018. Due to safety concerns, depositing yard waste will be restricted until after February 9, 2018.
- In preparation for installing the new Transfer Station scale, a gas monitoring well is scheduled to be installed nearest to the scale location on February 13, 2018.
- The culvert located on Old County Road just south of Prince Valley Road is tentatively scheduled to be repaired in the last week of February or early March 2018. The work is to be completed by Lawrence Lynch Corp in collaboration with the DPW.
- Due to recent questions about the acceptance of demolition waste (concrete, bricks, asphalt pavement, masonry, plaster, gypsum wallboard, toilets, lumber, wood) we contacted DEP and confirmed that the Board of Health Regulations are consistent with DEP.
- January 11, 2018 marked the first day of a new Board of Health regulation allowing a six-month Transfer Station permit. Since then, there have been sales of the new permit type, including a new home owner and a renter who recently moved to Town.

Harbor Master

- Attended a Barnstable County Dredge Advisory Committee meeting to discuss scheduling and the ability to get a waiver to dredge past the time of year restriction.
- A Shellfish Advisory Committee meeting is scheduled to review applications for shellfish licenses in preparation for a Public Hearing scheduled February 13th.
- Warmer weather has freed up floating ice which finally moved out of the Harbor but some of the movement of that ice caused some damage to a licensed Shellfish Grant off of Beach Point.
- Shellfish harvesting remains robust as nearly 50 people gathered at Pamet Harbor over the weekend.
