
Town of Truro Town Manager's Weekly Report

Announcements:

- Effective Monday, the Governor rescinded the Stay-at-Home Advisory between the hours of 10 pm and 5 am and the order requiring certain businesses to close by 9:30 pm. Capacity limits of 25% for most industries and gathering limits will continue until at least February 8, 2021.
- Citizens can view virtual meetings on Channel 18 in Truro and on the web on the
 "Truro TV Channel 18" button under "Helpful Links" on the homepage of the
 Town of Truro website. Click on the green "Watch" button in the upper right of
 the page or join the meeting using the phone number/ link included on the
 agenda.
- COVID-19 cases continue to creep up in the Commonwealth and in our region. Truro has nine active COVID cases. Please remain vigilant. Wear a mask, wash your hands and practice social distancing.
- Don't give up! Wear your mask! As a reminder, the Town of Truro and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts have masking requirements for the public. This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office:

- The COVID Team met this week to discuss vaccine distribution plans. Staff is fielding many calls regarding vaccines and has posted an important announcement from Barnstable County clarifying the COVID-19 Vaccination Process which explains that "although residents seventy-five years and older will be the next group eligible (Phase 2) to receive a COVID-19 vaccination beginning Monday, February 1, most will not find an available appointment immediately on Cape Cod. The reasons for the delay in the timeline are twofold: we are still in the process of vaccinating the initial eligible groups in Phase 1, and we do not yet have an adequate supply of the vaccine." DPW

- DPW Director Cabral has completed a site visit with Charge Point for installing a two-port car charging station at Town Hall. Charge Point will submit a revised proposal early next week.
- Solid waste totals continue to trend upward. We expect to approach 1,900 ton by the end of the fiscal
 year (June 30th). This is 237.69 ton above last year's solid waste total and is 204.32 ton above our threeyear average.
- Recycling is also on the rise. We expect to approach 600 ton by the end of the fiscal year. This is 131 ton above last year's total and 165.73 ton above our three-year average.

Harbor Master/Shellfish Constable

- The Harbor Master boat was serviced at Bay Sails.
- Shellfish Constable Jackett is working on the town shellfish permit regarding types of shellfish and areas to be seeded.
- There was a good turnout for shell fishing over the weekend despite very windy and cold conditions.
