- Town Meeting articles were due today at 4 pm. Staff is currently planning for an outdoor Town Meeting, to be held at the Truro Central School Ballfield on May 1, 2021 (rain date: May 2, 2021).

 Legislators led the meeting where collaborators described the consortium of entities that will work together to provide a safety net to ensure that vulnerable citizens from Yarmouth to Provincetown are able to be vaccinated.
- Town staff and I met to discuss a new Commonwealth of Massachusetts grant portal to determine which Truro projects might be eligible and competitive for the available grants.


